Guest Speaker John Donlan




John Donlan is the Superintendent of the property. He started out as a Camper at age 7 and has been on the property ever since. His responsibilities include maintaining the property and supervising a crew. He lives on the property year round. John updated us on the NEW \$3M Dining Hall and gave us a tour of some of the cabins. Camp Rotary is the oldest and longest running continuous Rotary Project for over 100 years. The Camp consists of waterfront, 50 buildings, 50 acres, has 240 overnight campers daily during the 8 weeks of summer, and has a

number of fun daily activities including: biking's, swimming, boating, arts and crafts, group time, sports, archery and a ropes course.

Camp Rotary is a private, nonprofit, educational, independent, co-ed overnight camp for kids ages 7-15. The camp has a rich history dating back to 1921 when it was founded as a service project of the Lynn Rotary Club. Although the majority of our campers come from the northeastern section of Massachusetts, there are campers from many other states that make the trip each summer. Additionally, each year the camp has children participating from several South American and European countries. The average age of the campers is approximately 12 years old, but typically there are campers of every age bracket from 7 to 15 years old represented each session.



Wenham - William E. Lee, 90, of Wenham, died Sunday afternoon, September 18, 2022, at his home in Wenham surrounded by his beloved family. He was the husband of Marilyn (Smith) Lee, with whom he shared 54 years of marriage. Born in Danvers on Oct. 10, 1931, he was the son of the late Howard and Hilda (Spence) Lee.
